# General Changes which affect all Constitutions.

- Changes based as closely as possible on Area Lead Option.
- Where no change is necessary, the wording of the old Constitutions is followed.



# General Changes which affect all Constitutions

• General Principle: some clauses have been included which give us the *Freedom* to exercise certain powers, but not the *Obligation* to do so.



# General Changes which affect all Constitutions

- Updated to reflect other ANC decisions,
   e.g.:
  - Associate Members to be members of Second-Tier Groups Only.
  - Wording of aims as amended at ANC 2004



# General Changes which affect all Constitutions.

- Updated to reflect current state of 18 Plus, e.g.:
  - No Regions.
  - Obsolete terminology abolished.



# General Changes which affect all Constitutions.

#### Not a Charity!

- But some provisions included to make
   Charitable status easier to obtain, should we ever decide to do so in the future.
- If we ever decide to become a charity, that will have to be the object of a separate vote in the future.



# General Changes which affect all Constitutions

• All Constitutions / Standing Orders which are in conflict with it are automatically superseded.



- "The National Federation of Eighteen Plus Areas"
- The Members are the Six Areas themselves.
- No provision for dealing with individuals, except:
  - Office holders
  - Those attending National meetings.
- All other articles dealing with individuals are devolved to the Area and Group Constitutions.



 Provisions relating to Meetings of the National Federation heavily amended to reflect the Area Lead Option.



- Some miscellaneous amendments, to reflect:
  - Potential Charitable considerations; and
  - The fact that the old Constitution could have been drafted better.



 Apart from amendments previously mentioned, the wording of the old constitution is followed where possible.



# National Constitution: Details

- Four NEC meetings per year: February;
   May; August; November.
- February Meeting = Annual General Meeting.
- Areas to pay National levy quarterly: I.e. £125 in February, May, August and November.



## National Constitution: Details

- Changing the Constitution:
  - Changes to Purposes of the National Federation must be Unanimous.
  - All other changes by majority vote of the NEC, after the procedure in the Area Lead Option carried out.
  - Constitutional change can never take place at an Inquorate meeting.



# National Constitution: Details

#### Miscellaneous Provisions:

- A proper "Dissolution Clause" each Area gets an equal share of the goodies if the National Association closes.
- Power to pay for Trustee Indemnity Insurance for NEC members very important!
- National Federation technically still has power to run an Office and employ members of staff – but has no obligation to do so.
- Power to turn the AGM into an "ANC-like" event if desired (but again – no obligation to do so).



# Overview of Model Area Constitution

- The Area and the Area Committee now take over the roles in relation to Groups and individuals that were formerly exercised by National and by the NEC.
- Provisions relating to Membership revised to reflect that it is handled by the Areas, not the National Tier.
- Distinction between "Area Council" and "Area Secretariat" abolished: now replaced by single concept of "Area Committee".
- Provisions on Area Conferences heavily amended to reflect changes made necessary by the Area Lead Option.



- Roles taken over by the Areas from National:
  - Collects Membership fee (which is still set by National).
  - Termination of Membership
  - Suspension / Closure of Groups
  - Resolution of Conflicts



- Changes made necessary by the Area Lead Option:
  - Membership of Individuals now a matter for the Area, not National Tier.
  - Constitution guarantees Members will be recognised as such by other Areas.
  - Transfer of Membership now reflects fact it must be coordinated by Areas between themselves.
  - Provision specifically written in for National Honorary Life Members!



- Changes made necessary by the Area Lead Option:
  - New concept of "Obligatory Motions" at Area
     Conferences introduced.
  - An Obligatory Motion is one which affects the National Tier, and is subject to the process for constitutional change as outlined in the new National Constitution.
  - Sent to the Area Conference by the National Tier and must be debated – hence the name!



- More on so-called "Obligatory Motions":
  - However, once they are introduced for debate,
     they may be amended in the usual fashion.
  - An Area Conference may thus do the following with Obligatory motions:
    - Adopt them unamended.
    - Adopt them as amended.
    - Reject them outright.
    - "Take notice" of them.



# Overview of Standard Groups Constitution

- References to the "National Federation" replaced with references to "the Area" in the majority of cases.
- Vast bulk of Groups constitution unchanged.



# Standard Groups Constitution: Details

- Major change: Transfer of membership which mirrors corresponding provisions in Area Constitution.
- AGMs, not Bi-AGMs.
- Area Committee supervises, hears appeals, etc, where NEC used to do.
- Other changes as per Area Lead Option.



### Second-Tier Groups

- References to "National" replaced with "Area" as per Area Lead Option.
- Otherwise mostly unchanged.



### Implementation

- Constitutions to be adopted at ANC 2006.
- No opening of one organisation and closure of second organisation.
- Instead, current Federation will itself be transformed into the new organisation.
- National Federation to de-register for VAT.



- With Immediate Effect (Close of business at this ANC)
  - ANC closes and the new constitutions come into force!
  - All groups to make cheques for individuals'
    membership fees payable to their own Area when
    sending them to their Area Membership Officer.
- May 1st 2006
  - Areas become liable to pay National their first quarterly levy of £125



### • May 2006

- Areas: Hold "Transitional Conferences"
- Groups: Hold "Transitional Bi-Agms"
- National: First NEC meeting under held under new system.



- June / July 2006
  - Areas hold their first quarterly conferences under the new constitutions
    - (Not less than 30 days and not more than 60 days after the NEC meeting).



- August 1st 2006
  - Areas pay next quarterly levy
- August 2006
  - NEC Meeting
- September / October 2006
  - Next quarterly Area Conference.
- November 1st 2006
  - Areas pay another quarterly levy
- November 3rd 2006
  - WASH!
- November 2006
  - NEC Meeting



- January 2007
  - Area: Annual Conference
  - Groups: AGM
- February 1<sup>st</sup> 2007
  - Yet another quarterly levy now due from Areas to National
- February 2007
  - National AGM.
