ASEA – Written report from Martin.

Some discussion about bank admin problems

Midland. John Smith (by now arrived) gave a verbal report. Area subsidised some group xmas meals. Has a few events coming up. There is a £100 publicity grant which 2 groups took up. Bromsgrove has closed and members have gone back to Solihull. The organisers at Bromsgrove had too many work commitments. "So no real lessons to be learned". No real financial movement.

NTAC. Written report. Didcot's Theatre discounts have been killed off by Covid.

SA – None.

7. Officer Reports

National Chair – Had a zoom meeting to finalise NAGM stuff. There will be more to do coming up.

NFO – Did the budget. Only has half access to the bank. MD – should we open new account? MD / AJ agree Lloyds probably best bank.

MD / IC / AJ / EK to do the bank paperwork at WASH, then James Oliver can transfer £14K across.

MP proposed that the surplus for the 80th account goes back into National funds. TB seconded. Carried Unanimously.
